Scare you



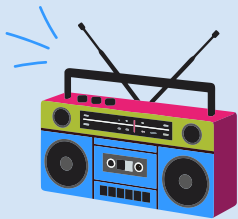
Make you feel unsafe

Cooking smells

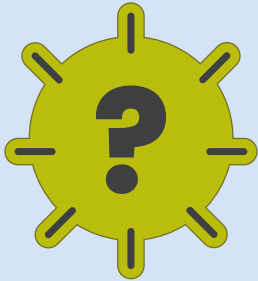

We may not take action for these.



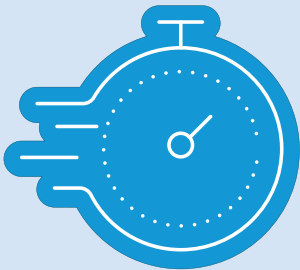

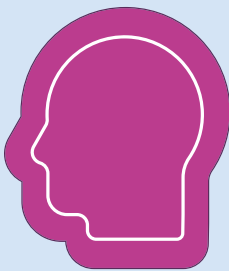

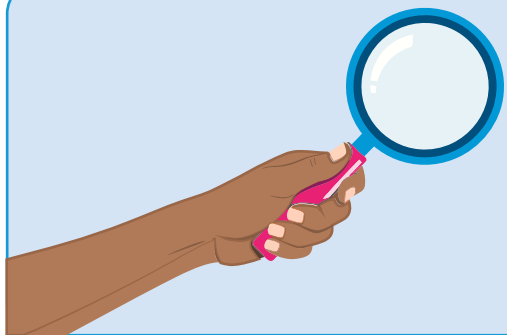


Who was involved
