The boring bit...

We've put together a few tips and things to consider to help ensure your event is enjoyable for everyone.

Fire safety

- Make note of any potential hazards and have measures in place to control them
- Assign a designated fire evacuation point and let everyone who is attending know where it is

Health and safety

- ▶ If a third party is providing inflatables, such as a bouncy castle, ensure they have suitable insurance in place
- ▶ If your event means closing a road, you must ask your local council for permission

Food and entertainment

If third-party caterers or entertainment such as a band or DJ are attending, ensure they hold their own Public Liability Insurance (the minimum we advise is £5M)
