MAKING A DIFFERENCE TO OUR SERVICES

Scrutiny makes a real difference to the way Saxon Weald delivers service to residents. As a task and finish group member, you will give an independent customer view of how services can be improved and delivered.

You will receive training and develop a wide range of skills, which may help you in applying for jobs or gaining other voluntary positions. It may also appeal to you if you are not seeking any of the above but just feel you have something to offer.

WHO DO WE NEED?

We are looking for people to join task and finish groups who have a commitment and enthusiasm for improving and developing services for all Saxon Weald residents.

PERSONAL QUALITIES

We would expect a task and finish group member to have the following qualities:

- A good listener
- A good communicator
- Tactful and diplomatic
- Open minded and non-judgemental
- Respect others and their views
- Able to share knowledge and skills





WHAT SKILLS ARE REQUIRED?

The following table lists the key skills and experience you need to be an effective member of the task and finish group. Some skills are essential but others can be developed with training and support from Saxon Weald.

AREA	SKILLS AND QUALITIES
Commitment	 Able to commit sufficient time to the role and attend meetings. Willing to show commitment to personal and group learning. Commit time to reading papers in advance of meetings. Attend and participate in training sessions.
Skills	 Ability to work with others to reach decisions together. Ability to balance the needs and desires of residents with pressures on the organisation. Able to act in the interests of all customers. Ability to express views clearly. Ability to challenge constructively, respecting other people's views. Ability to analyse written information. Make decisions based on evidence. Work to agreed deadlines. Support majority decisions.
Knowledge and experience	 Ability to analyse and question performance information. Understanding of the issues facing residents. Respect confidential information.
Equality and diversity	Demonstrate an understanding of and commitment to equality and diversity issues.





WHO CAN APPLY?

Anybody who is a Saxon Weald resident can join a task and finish group.

WHAT IS THE TIME COMMITMENT?

Group members meet at least once a month and must also be willing to take part in training and other task and finish group activities. The amount of time depends on each task and finish topic. During periods of high activity, you may be required to take part two or three times a month.


HOW DO I BENEFIT FROM THIS?
